#### Who will use the answers and how?

## How will my personal data be processed?

The EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), the Official Statistics Act (2001:99) and the Official Statistics Ordinance (2001:100) contain provisions on processing personal data. In addition, there are rules in the Act on Supplementary Provisions to the EU General Data Protection Regulation (2018:218) and in regulations issued in association with this Act.
